April showers bring ... PARCC testing???

Welcome back from Spring Break! As we move into the beginning of Fourth Quarter, we take the time to assess the work that our students have done over this past school year and begin planning for next year. This assessment comes in the form of PARCC and Spring MAP testing. Teachers have been diligently working with students to address the Illinois Learning Standards through lessons carefully aligned to these standards. The PARCC test asks students to address questions that are reflective of these standards and the student responses to these questions serves as a good gauge for us to measure how well our curriculum is organized and delivered for understanding. We are able to utilize the existing Math and ELA times in our schedule so as to minimize the impact to the student's day. Testing will take place on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of these first two weeks of April. Please remind your children to get plenty of rest, eat a good breakfast and charge their Chromebooks nightly so that they are ready to do their best when they come to school each day.

We are also looking forward to meeting with our families at our Spring Open House night on Thursday, April 19<sup>th</sup>. The evening will begin with an introduction to middle school for our incoming 6<sup>th</sup> grade parents at 6:00 p.m. Following this, we will have learning sessions for our current 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> grade parents, at 6:30 and 7:00 p.m., about topics relevant to the lives of our PKMS students. Topics include, the current State of PK, helping your middle school student with the social / emotional challenges of this time of life, how to best use Canvas, what does a S.T.E.A.M. lesson look like in the classroom, and how to best navigate the transition to Central Middle School and 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Keep an eye out for our flyers advertising this evening and the specific sessions that you can attend.

Lastly, we want to thank our students and families for their support of our events at PKMS. We know that we are fortunate to have students and families who value the learning opportunities that the teachers and paraprofessionals plan and deliver each day in the classrooms. It is through this positive relationship that we continue to be inspired as educators to grow as a learning organization so that we can best serve our PKMS community.

### **DENTAL REMINDER FOR GRADES K, 2, & 6TH**

The state of Illinois requires all students who are in Kindergarten, 2nd, and 6th grade to have a dental examination completed and on file in the health office by May 15th. The dental examination must be completed within 18 months prior to the 05/15/18 deadline (earliest accepted date of exam: 11/15/16). If you have not already done so, please send in the completed examination form to the health office as soon as possible.

## **Spring Parent-Teacher Conferences by Team request.**

On **Thursday, April 12<sup>th</sup>**, PKMS will hold Parent-Teacher conferences from 4:00 – 8:00 p.m. Due to the nature of conferences at the middle school being conducted with the grade-level teams, there are limited time slots available. Because of this, the Spring Parent-Teacher conferences are first scheduled by team request so that the teachers can meet with those parents and students that they most need to touch bases with before the end of the school year. Priority scheduling for these conferences is being given to parents/guardians who are requested by the teachers. If you have questions for your child's teachers, and were not contacted for a formal conference, please reach out to that individual teacher via email or phone.

## **PARCC Testing begins April 10.**

During the second week of April, we will begin PARCC testing with the students. We will utilize the students' block schedule to administer the tests, to minimize the impact to the students' schedule. We found this to work well for us the last two years. Testing will begin on Tuesday, April 10<sup>th</sup>, and run only during the ELA/Math block time on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of the second and third weeks of April. Since the ELA and Math classes are blocked together, we will have the needed time to complete the tests, and not disrupt the Social Studies, Science, and Encore, P.E., or Lunch periods. Additionally, since District #301 is now a 1:1 district, our students will be able to utilize their Chromebooks for testing, further reducing the overall disruption to the school day. We ask that you remind your children to charge their Chromebooks each night and to bring their headphones / earbuds with them each day of testing.

Mark your calendars for Thursday, April 19th! We will be holding mini parent universities from 6:30-7:30 p.m. Sessions will run for 25 minutes each. Topics include an introduction to Canvas, School Safety and Social Media, Transition to Central Middle School, Organization and Study Skills, Addressing Social/Emotional Needs of Your Child, among others. 
## **Safe entrance to PKMS.**

## 6<sup>th</sup> Grade Team News

**ELA:** This month in ELA, students will be introduced to a new science fiction read aloud. Students will also be completing a 50 First Pages assignment with their own independent novel in which they will be reacting to their reading. Towards the end of the month, we will be starting our first book club!

**Science:** We have been exploring index fossils and how they help us determine the relative age of sedimentary rock layers. We made a model of geologic time and marked some important events in the history of the Earth. It was almost as long as our main hallway! Now on to igneous rocks, volcanoes, and plate tectonics.

**SS:** As we head out of the Empires of Ancient Rome, we'll be getting into the Middle Ages and learning about how society was halted by the Black Death and the military campaigns of the Crusades. The signing of the Magna Carta of 1215 will seal the deal as we see how it impacts our government today. We'll also be looking at the various roles that religions, kingdoms, leaders and societies play in the "ever changing Europe."

**Math:** 6th Grade math wrapped up their Geometry unit right before spring break began. They will now be moving onto the last topic of 6th grade math: statistics! Students have been regularly preparing for PARCC as it is quickly approaching.

## 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Team News

**7th grade math-** Students just wrapped up a unit with writing and solving equations for geometry. Next we dive into our statistics unit, comparing data for two populations and making inferences about them.

**Pre-Algebra-** Our next unit of study is an eighth grade unit, solving systems of equations. This unit allows students to solve a wider variety of real-world problems by using two variables and two equations.



**ELA-** We just finished our Responsibility Unit where students gave an Explanatory speech about someone who has bettered our society and shown social responsibility. Next up is our Equality unit, which covers a variety of groups who have struggled to gain equal rights throughout history and now, such as women, immigrants, African Americans, etc. Students will engage in a variety of texts and activities throughout the unit, culminating with them writing a narrative story inspired by what they have learned.

**SS-** The Constitution Unit is over! We'll open April with one week of looking at the Illinois Constitution and then continue our study of Early American History by looking at some of the earliest Presidencies and the challenges America faced. We'll see how these events have come to shape our nation as it is today, while leading into May's study of America's expansion.

**Sci-**We just wrapped up some important cell functions such as making energy for our entire body. We will be entering 4th quarter looking at what makes all of our students so special with our Heredity unit. Here students will take a deeper look at what makes them look the way they do among other genetic features.

# World Languages News

Each quarter, some of the Central High School German Honors Society and Spanish Honors Society students come to speak with the 7<sup>th</sup> grade World Languages classes! They lay out both language programs at the 8<sup>th</sup> grade and high school levels going over topics such as: cultural foods, course content, and what the typical high school language class is like. Students present on the travel abroad opportunities offered at Central High and always end the sessions by answering an array of different questions posed by the 7<sup>th</sup> grade students.



We are the feeder program for the Central High School Rockets. Our goal is to teach the fundamental terminology, skills, and life-lessons that align with Rocket football and cheer philosophies, and to prepare our athletes for success on and off the field!

## FLAG FOOTBALL



**(Grades K-1)**

Players will learn basics of the game including offensive and defensive awareness with an emphasis on running with the ball. Teachable moments, sportsmanship and developing a love of the game through self-confidence while having fun is our desired outcome!

### Practices and Games

Practices will be held at Panther Field twice a week from 6-7:30 pm, starting in August. Our teams compete against other "in-house" teams, with one weekly game scheduled from 6-7:30 pm at Panther Field. The program consists of eight games which commence after several practice sessions.

### Cross-Over Clinics

Periodically throughout the season, our Tackle Football teams will provide mentoring sessions with our Flag players to help integrate the programs and inspire the younger player to reach the level of tackle football.
