Principal's Message



Welcome to October, everyone! The sun is rising later and setting earlier, the temperatures are getting cooler and the Cubs are chasing playoff dreams once again! It is amazing to me that we are already in the month of October and that First Quarter is more than half-way through; it seems that we only just started the school year. However, we are well underway and usual, our students and staff have settled into their learning roles and routines.

Speaking of learning roles and routines, we are striving to make more information available to our families about the learning strategies that we are putting into place to benefit our students. Two things that I would like to highlight this month are course syllabi and annotation of text. We undertook the goal last year of writing course syllabi, using a common format, for all of our classes here at PKMS. In fact, the format that we use was developed in conjunction with the administrations at Central Middle School and Central High School. Educational research is clear that one aspect of student success is the ability to navigate the educational system. Our goal, in this area, is to help students and families understand the expectations of classes by using a commonly formatted document for grades 6 – 12. The PKMS syllabi can be found on our school website under the “For Students” tab.

A second school improvement goal that we are working on building-wide is the skill of annotating text. Annotation is a written record of how readers think as they read, instead of after they read. Essentially, it is the skill of marking up text to capture thoughts, engage the reader, record ideas for later use and, among other things, to help the reader pinpoint what is important. As adults, we tend to do this automatically, but it is a skill that needs to be developed over time. Our ELA teachers have begun teaching this to our students and the other subject areas are also incorporating this skill into their class work, adjusting as necessary to authentically align to their discipline. Our goal, in this area, is to provide students with another tool that they can use to improve their connection to literature.

Throughout the year, we will continue to share our goals and strategies to better partner with our families as we move forward in the education of your children. Also, remember to join us as we celebrate the athletic and social side of middle school education! Check out our Athletics page to find out when our Falcons are competing against other schools, watch our school calendar for upcoming Band, Chorus and drama events, and be sure to check out our S.T.A.R. Club's latest fundraiser to help the victims of Hurricane Florence.

News from Nurse Tracy Grote

During the months of October and November vision and hearing screenings will be conducted by an Illinois Department of Public Health certified technician. All new students and 6th and 7th grade students in special education will be screened. If your student wears glasses, there will be a brief inspection of the glasses for obvious damage, however vision is not tested as it is expected these students are assessed annually by an eye doctor. If you prefer your student not be screened for vision and/or hearing, please notify the nurse in writing.

As a reminder, 6th grade physicals and immunizations are required to be on file in the school health office by October 15, 2018.

Drop Off Zone

What is the Drop off Zone? This is where items like lunch boxes, Chromebooks, homework and other items might be dropped off in the office by a parent. Even though we have ambassadors to deliver, it is still the student's responsibility to check in the office for these items.

Destruction of Student Records

Central Community Unit School District 301 will destroy special education records from school years 2012-13 and prior of students who graduated, transferred, or otherwise permanently withdrew from special education services. Special education records may include reports of psychological and social work evaluations, multidisciplinary planning conferences, annual reviews, copies of Individual Education Programs and other relevant information. If a parent or student wants those records, they should call the Student Support Services & Special Education Office at 847-464-5863 before October 26, 2018.

In social studies classes, students read newspapers, magazines, and tabloids from the month after 9/11. They compared and contrasted information and opinions, assessed the validity of the sources and discussed the far reaching effects of 9/11.

6th Grade News

ELA - The 6th grade ELA students have learned about plot, reading formats and genres, and how to read a graphic novel already this year. Additionally, they have been through a “6th Grade University” class where they learned how to closely read a text, including annotating a text and finding text evidence; this will help our students in all of their classes. Also, all 6th grade students started reading *Roller Girl* by Victoria Jamieson at the end of September to kick off our graphic novel book club. Coming up next in our Acceptance Unit—writing narratives that include perfectly formatted dialogue!

Math - Students will be strengthening their number sense through investigation with negative numbers and how they relate to real world situations. We will also be starting a project where they can use what they learned in our second unit to build their own amusement park on a coordinate grid.

Social Studies- This month we are full-fledged into Ancient China. We are learning about different dynasties, their rulers, government, philosophies and inventions that are still being used today! Study of the Silk Road is on the horizon and students will experience how the much desired commodity of silk generated a trade route that spread not only goods but ideas, religion and cultures!



Science - We have started our first earth science unit called Earth's History. We will be using the Grand Canyon as an example as we study the processes that shaped Earth's surface. Students will also be learning how scientists examine rock layers to determine what has happened in the past on earth. Students will begin to understand that rocks and rock layers are like history books. They hold a lot of information about what has happened on Earth during the 4.6 billion years of Earth's existence.

7th Grade News

In ELA, students have finished reading a Sherlock Holmes mystery story and will be watching the movie version before working on a compare and contrast essay. We will be working on various elements of argument writing as the weeks progress. Students from both 6th grade and 7th grade ELA classes are working together on a project related to the events from 9/11. Both grades have read aloud fictional novels that they are comparing and discussing through pen pal letters. We are looking forward to this activity in the next few weeks.

In Science students are working how now figure out the answer to the question: What is life? They will be able to tell the difference between living and non-living things as well as be able to show how we organize and classify various organisms like true scientist. In October they will be working with microscopes and getting a chance to look at microorganisms that we cannot see with our naked eye.

In Social Studies in the month of October we'll be finishing up our 13 Colonies Unit and moving into our Revolutionary War Unit. We focus mostly on the events that lead up to the war, and how those events and ideals that started the revolution still impact our country and national identity today. We'll also be deep into our class reading of Johnny Tremain, a historical fiction novel where a boy the age of our students gets mixed up in all of the events leading to the war.

7th grade math students are finishing up their unit on rational numbers. We have been adding, subtracting, multiplying, and dividing positive and negative numbers (fractions, decimals, and whole numbers). Students will take their unit assessment on September 26. Students should use their study guide, notes, homework, and classwork to prepare for this big test! After the unit test, we will begin the unit on expressions.

Halloween Costume Rules

With Halloween quickly approaching, we encourage students at PKMS to dress for the day, yet there are a few things that they need to know to maintain a safe and productive learning environment:

1. **Halloween attire must meet school dress code stipulations!**
2. Do not wear, or bring, masks to school. Face paint may not cover the entire face.
3. If your choice is a sports theme, no baseball bats, hockey sticks, golf clubs, etc. are allowed. Also, do not wear cleats or spikes as they may damage floors and become slipping hazards.
4. No weapons, or look-alike weapons, are allowed at any time. No spikes, chains or ropes may be brought to school. Failure to follow this rule may result in disciplinary consequences.
5. Make up, hair dye, sunglasses and hats are permitted as long as they are not dangerous or disruptive. Sunglasses and hats must be removed in the classroom.
6. No clothing or props that depict drugs, alcohol or their usage are permitted.
7. Costumes should not prevent the student from fully participating in learning activities. Use good judgement!
8. All make up and accessories must be put on at home.
9. Building administration has the right to require students to change their apparel if it is deemed that the costume is not appropriate for school. If a change of clothing is not available, students will be required to put on their gym uniform.




